Promoting science in the public arena by enrollment in advanced science or science education classes, attendance at science workshops, initiation, active participation and/or leadership roles in workshops for other science teachers, presentation of science education papers at local, regional, national or international science/education meetings or conferences, active participation in local, regional, state, national or international science/science education organizations, publication of papers or books, or other activities that, in your opinion, would qualify him/her for this award.
- 3.) Undertaking mentoring responsibilities for students, other teachers and/or members of the general public as they relate to science education.
- 4.) Accepting mentoring from others who have demonstrated success in the promotion of science education to students, teachers and the general public.
